ord: Patrick Adamczyk, Matt Adamczyk, and Trevor Hoffman. Matt Adamczyk had even further success as he advanced to Semi-




State. The Hebron student body sent him off in style at the end of the day before his match showing up to line the halls with high fives and encouragement all around. Matt is current-
