As the Hebron wrestling season comes to an end, we have many memories to look back on. The team had a very successful season having Matt Adamczyk, the first freshman to make it to semi-state and Ewan Donovan, being the first state qualifier in history. Both were very successful and have

set the benchmark for what dreams are acheivable here in the small town of Hebron. These two wrestlers have set and beat a multitude of records and will continue to inspire in the years to come.

The Hebron wrestling program had many firsts this season. Freshman, Matt

Adamczyk went with a record of 28-5 for the season. He was Hebron's first ever Freshman to win the GSSC Conference and first ever freshman to qualify to wrestle in IHSAA Semi-State. He was champion in his weight class for the Rensselaer Super Dual Tournament and the Valparaiso Super Dual Tournament. He was also Voted Wrestler of the Tournament by oppos-

ing coaches. The wrestling team cannot wait to see what Matt has in store! Everyone is proud of how much he accomplished as just a freshman!



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
### **Hebron Band**

### **Business Professionals of America**


